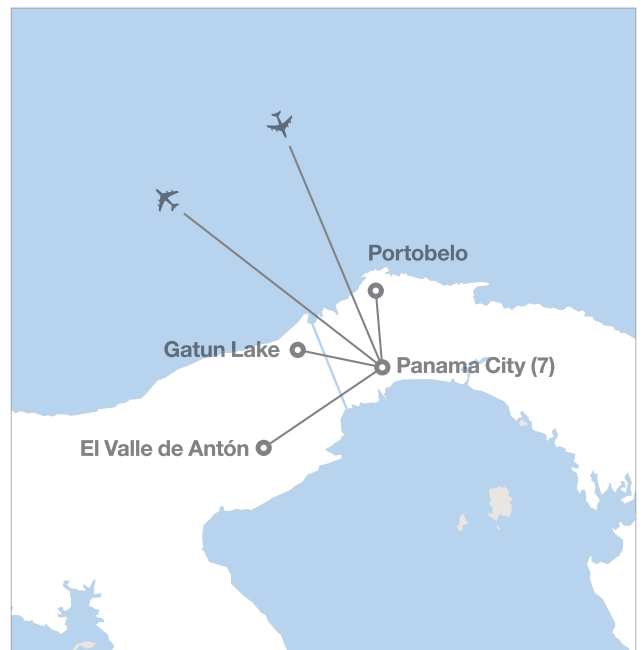

Wander the Spanish city of Panamá Viejo, which dates back to 1519.



Day 1: Fly to Panama

Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Panama City, then check into your hotel.

Day 2: Panama City

Visit the Panamá Viejo ruins, remnants of the first Spanish city founded on the Pacific Coast of the Americas. The city was destroyed by pirates in 1671. Take a walking tour of Panama City's colorful historic quarter and UNESCO World Heritage Site, Casco Viejo. Admire the residence of Panama's president before browsing an arts and crafts market. Explore the Biomuseo, a Frank Gehry-designed building. Exhibits here delve into the area's unique biodiversity, caused by tectonic plate movement that pushed Central and South America together. Then split into smaller groups to explore the Amador Causeway and enjoy the Panama City skyline.

Day 3: Panama City | El Valle de Antón

Journey west on the Pan-American Highway. Visit a local pineapple farm, where you'll tour the site with local farmers and sample pineapple snacks. Hike nature trails in El Valle de Antón, and tonight, experience some of the country's local culture at a folklore dance show.

Day 4: Panama City | Gatun Lake

Keep an eye out for toucans, sloths, and other exotic animals as you hike one of the lush parks that surround Panama City. Enjoy a boat ride on Gatun Lake, the glistening, man-made heart of the Panama Canal, and around Monkey Island, home to a variety of monkey species.

Day 5: Panama City

Participate in a cultural exchange for a look into the day-to-day lives of local students. Explore the famed Panama Canal, one of the most influential engineering projects ever undertaken and one of the seven wonders of the modern world. Completed by the United States in 1914, the 51-mile canal revolutionized international trade and signaled America's emergence as a global superpower.

Day 6: Panama City

In Río Chagres National Park, enjoy a canoe ride on the Río Chagres, the primary source of water for the Panama Canal. Immerse yourself in the culture and customs of the native people during your visit to an Emberá Indigenous Village on the banks of Lake Alajuela.

Day 7: Panama City | Portobelo

Swim alongside colorful sea creatures during a snorkeling adventure in Portobelo, a city on Panama's Caribbean coast. Head back on land to explore the Portobelo Ruins, fortifications where exports of gold and silver passed through centuries ago.

Day 8: Depart for home
